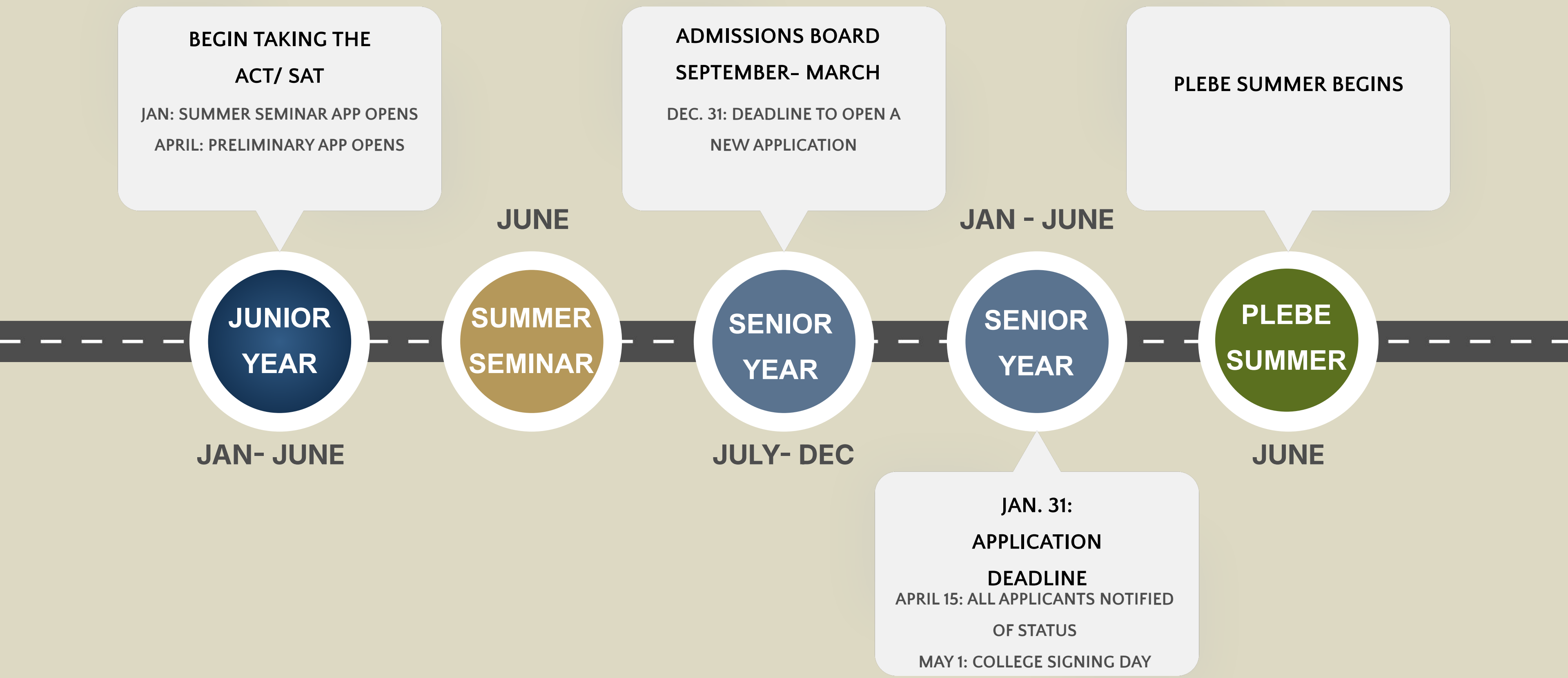

- **NO MINIMUM GPA**

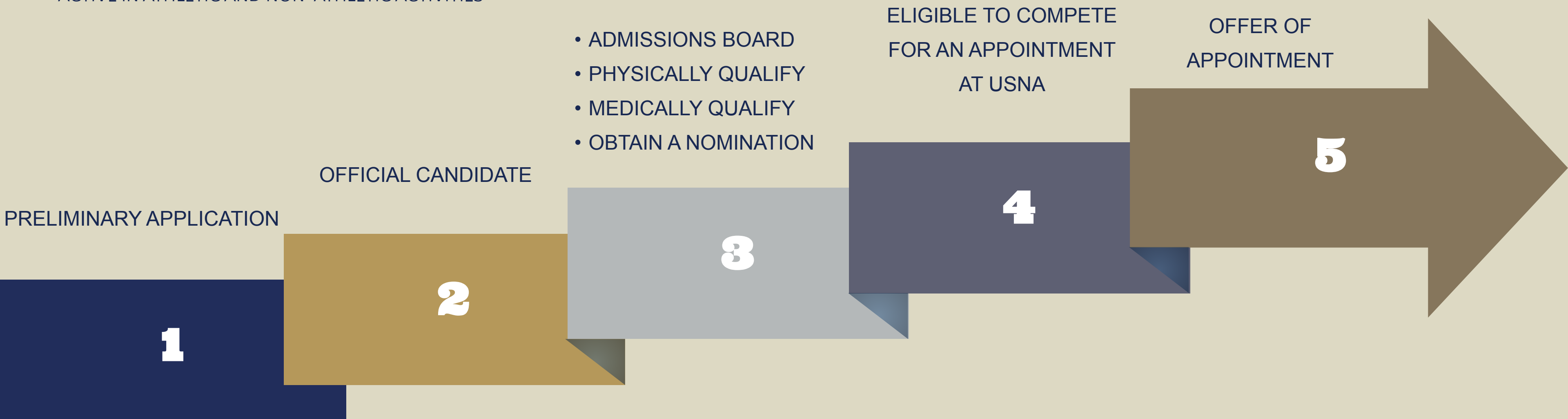
- STRIVE TO BE IN AT LEAST THE TOP 20% OF YOUR HIGH SCHOOL CLASS

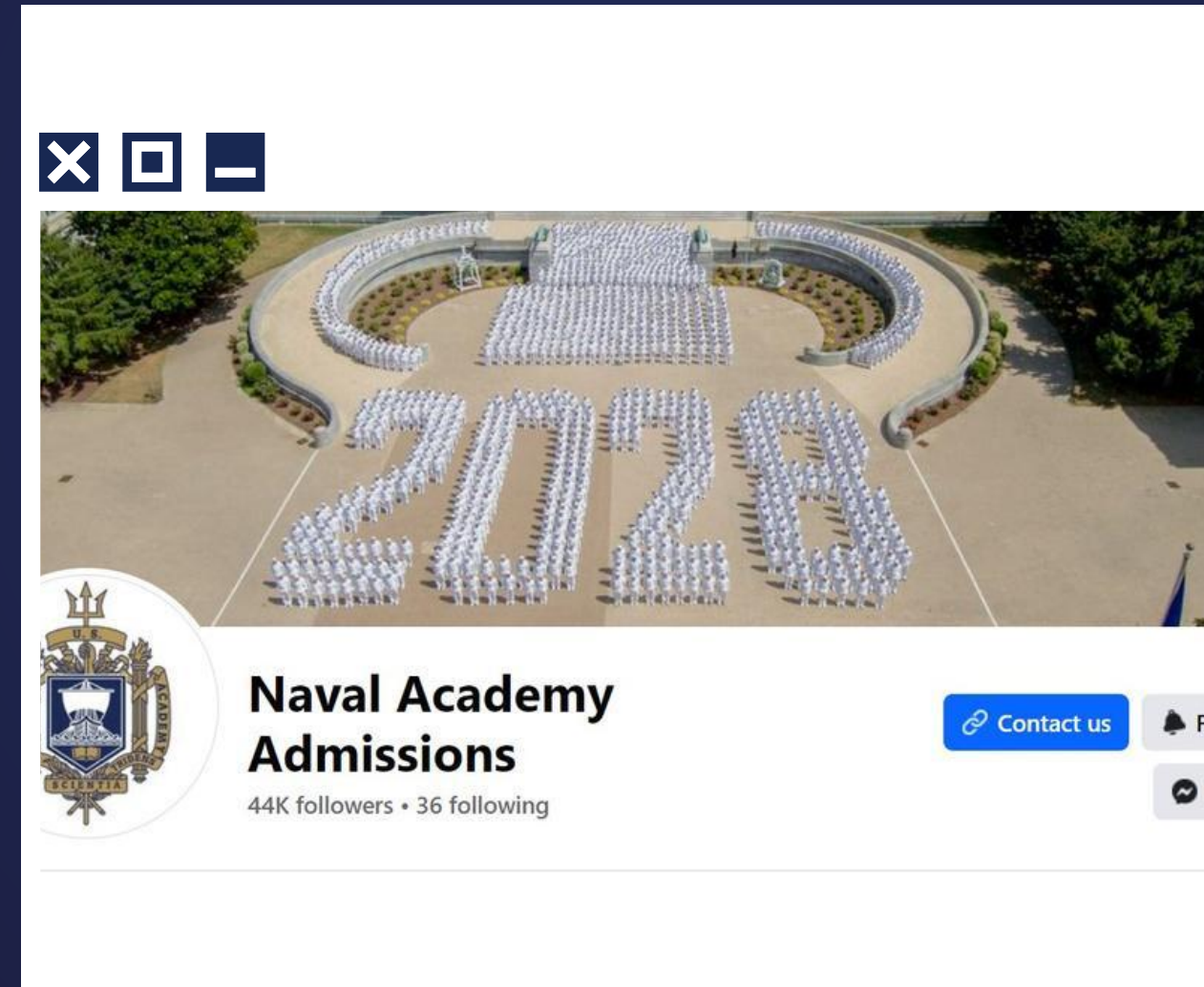
