



Continental Drifting?





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
Alfred Wegener

- 1912 Proposed hypothesis of continental drift
 - 200 million years ago
 - All continents formed a single landmass, Pangaea
 - Surrounded by one ocean,
 Panthalassa
- Not accepted until the 1950's
 - New science: Paleomagnetism



Wegener circa 1924-30 German polar researcher, geophysicist and meteorologist




Apparent Fit of Continents ? ? ?



Evidence of Continental Drift

Fossil Correlation –

- Identical fossils have been found in the rocks on either side of an ocean
- Age and type of rocks match on distant continents



- Identical rocks and mountain structures have been found on either side of an ocean
- Age and type of rocks match on distant continents



Evidence of Continental Drift

Paleoclimate Data –

- Climate patterns have changed due to land masses shifting and moving to different locations.
- Glacial debris and evidence now found in tropical areas
- Tropical fossils now found in arctic areas (E.g. Coal)

- His ideas weren't accepted until after his death (1950's)
- ...Enter <u>Harry Hess</u> and <u>Seafloor Spreading</u>


...But one thing was missing!

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
- Suggested that the seafloor is spreading a part at the mid-ocean ridge:
 - Magma wells up from the center of the ridge as the tectonic plates pull a part
 - New seafloor is created when the magma cools
 - This could be what Wegener was looking for...

Seafloor Spreading




- Mid-Atlantic Ridge: undersea range of mountains that divide the Atlantic ocean.
- Scientists used sonar to map it
- Found that the <u>rocks were</u> <u>relatively young near the</u> <u>center of the ridge and</u> <u>oldest near the</u> <u>coastlines</u>.



Earth's Magnetic Field


- Generated deep inside our planet
- Earth's solid inner core churns a liquid outer core (Iron and Nickel)
 - 1. Acts like convection
 - 2. Generates electric currents
 - 3. And...makes a magnetic field.



Earth's Poles Reverse




- The spinning and churning of the **Outer Core creates** Earth's magnetic fields.
- The magnetic poles are moving
- The poles reverse every 1000 to 1 million years.






Lava comes to the surface




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- When lava cools, minerals (like Iron (Fe)) align with the current magnetic field
- Stripes formed to either side of the Mid-Atlantic ridge


