

One-Pager Guidelines

Practicing Active Reading

A one-pager is a written and graphic interpretation of what you've just read presented on a single sheet of paper. In this assignment, you will demonstrate that you have successfully practiced five strategies commonly used by proficient readers. This one-pager will help showcase your thoughts and will provide a reference for later review or further study of the text.

Think of the one pager as an advertisement for what you are reading. Your final product should look something like a movie advertisement poster.

Guidelines:

- ☐ Use standard 8½" x 11" unlined paper
- ☐ Fill the entire paper
- ☐ Use ink (no pencil)
- ☐ Use **COLOR**
- ☐ Include ALL required information (may be arranged on the page any way you choose)
- ☐ The one-pager should be clear and understandable, easy-to-read and full of evidence of higher-level thought.

Required Information:

- ☐ **Title and author** (include the chapter if you are reading part of a book)
- ☐ At least 1 **prediction** ("I think....because....")
- ☐ An **explanation of a word or idea** that clarifies the meaning of the text
- ☐ **Two questions** about the text (Level 2 or higher)
- ☐ A 10 word sentence **summarizing** the text
- ☐ A **visual representation** of some important aspect of the text
